In 1992, Stan and Esther Allard donated this three-generation family farm to the people of Medina County. For decades, Allardale has been recognized as a leading example of stewardship and land conservation. In the 1930s, Allardale was one of the first farms in the county to practice soil-saying techniques such as contour strip farming and the planting of pines and spruces along steep hillsides. Since that time, it is estimated that over 100,000 trees have been planted in collections of black walnut, red and white oak, tuliptree, white pine, and cucumber tree to list only a few. Allardale has received numerous honors from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Division of Forestry.
