Tips for Bird Watching Beginners

Equipment

Bring binoculars or a spotting scope.

Be quiet

Birds are easily startled by loud noises and will flee to cover.

Avoid sudden movements

Just as loud noises startle birds, so does sudden movement.

Study habitat

Download an app or bring a field guide. Each bird is specially adapted to a particular habitat.

Be sure to have the sun at your back.

Avoid brightly colored clothes.

Wear darker colors or earth tones to blend into the background.

Be patient!

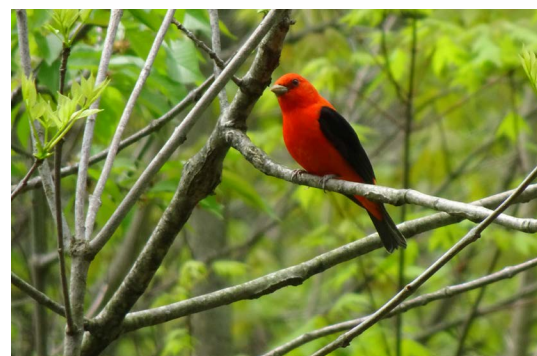
