

Sunday, September 1 - Ohio Butterfly Surveys: What's Being Done at Letha House Park? - Letha House Lodge (West) - 2 to 3 p.m. Long-term surveys are important because they help to monitor plant or animal populations over many years. Butterfly surveys are important because they are indicator species on the overall health of our environment. Join us as we hike, catch, and learn about butterflies and the park district's long-term survey at Letha House Park that started in 2013. Ages ten to adult. No registration is required. Free.

Saturday, September 7 - Native Plant Festival and Sale - Oenslager Nature Center - 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Join us, once again, for the second annual Native Plant Festival and Sale to explore the connection between native plants, people, and wildlife! Shop at the native plant sale, help tag monarchs, play some games, make some crafts, and visit with and learn from our important native plant partners such as Wild Ones, Medina County Master Gardeners, Greater Akron Audubon, and more. This will also serve as the pick-up location for the Medina County Soil and Water District's Invasive Species buy-back program (must have signed up previously through the soil and water district). Proceeds from the sales benefit Friends of Medina County Parks. All ages are welcome. No registration is required. Free.

Saturday, September 7 - The Essentials of Close-Quarters Boat Control Chippewa Yacht Club (Entrance is just past the Oaks Restaurant on Longacre Lane) - 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Knowledge of how your boat reacts in different situations is crucial to safe boating handling. In this class geared toward new and seasoned boaters, learn what to do and when to do it using factors like the wind and water current to assist you in putting your boat where you want it to be in close quarters. Skills that will be covered include: docking, ferrying, boater's eye, and much more. The class will be taught by ODNR using a center-console 18' Boston Whaler with 150 HP. Participants are required to bring proof of their boaters' licenses, their own USCG-approved inherently buoyant PFDs (no inflatables), and packed lunches. You will need to sign a waiver on the day of class. Ages 18 and up. Register by September 5. Free.


