Organization Overview

Medina County Park District is a local and regional leader in conservation, education, and the protection of natural resources. Responsibility

Under the supervision of the planning manager and deputy director, organizes, schedules, and coordinates the completion of a variety of planning and development projects, provides on-site construction support, and facilitates communication between the park district, contractors, and stakeholders

Examples of Duties

- Obtains price quotes from contractors and other vendors to complete specific tasks on the park district's annual capital projects list
- Communicates with and selects contractors for ongoing efforts including, but not limited to, parking lot striping and crack-sealing, dam mowing, and vegetation spraying
- Schedules and attends pre-construction meetings; provides on-site construction support and communication between the park district and contractors/consultants; ensures projects specifications and timelines are met; reviews final punch lists
- Creates, with administrative support, purchase orders for projects; receives, reviews, and processes invoices for payment; maintains project files
- Assists with the preparation of requests for qualifications (RFQs), requests for proposals (RFPs), answering questions to such documents, and scoring RFQs and RFPs in advance of contractor selection
- Maintains an inventory of signs, maps, interpretive panels, and other specialty installations throughout the park district
- Assists with the annual preparation of capital project lists and cost estimates
- Ensures projects adhere to best-practices, district standards. and regulations
- Reports deviations from plans and helps correct potential issues
- Safeguards and protects the environment during construction activities
- Completes/records inspection reports for projects
- May assist other departments with special projects
- Other duties as assigned

Necessary Knowledge, Skills, Abilities

- Proven teamwork, communication and partnership skills, and the ability to work directly with all levels of the organization to achieve common goals
- Demonstrated emotional intelligence including self-awareness, empathy,

reliability, and consistency; a proven track record of establishing and maintaining critical relationships internally and externally; demonstrated trust, integrity, and credibility

- Minimum of an associate's degree in a relevant field
- Ability to communicate effectively through writing, drawing, and speaking
- The ability to maintain effective working relationships with associates, other professionals, and the general public; the ability to handle sensitive inquiries from and contacts with other agencies and the general public
- The ability to define problems, collect data, establish facts, and draw conclusions
- Experience with project management and the ability to work with construction contractors and design consultants
- Familiarity with GIS and Microsoft Office
- Basic computer operations skills
- Ability to read maps and construction drawings
- Familiar with local, state, and federal permits/regulations
- Experience with the public procurement process

Required Physical Abilities Include the Following, But Are Not Limited To

- Must work in the outdoors under a wide range of conditions throughout the year, including heat and insects in summer and extreme cold in winter
- Must occasionally lift items in excess of 50 pounds
- Must occasionally work around heavy equipment during construction projects

Desired Training and Experience Requirements

- Any combination of training and experience that would indicate possession of the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities listed above
- Possession of a valid Ohio motor vehicle operator's license with a good driving record
- Satisfactory fingerprint and criminal background check and drug screening
